TRAVELING TO DC

DIRECTIONS TO THE SUBWAY (METRO) FROM HOTEL

To reach the Metro station from the hotel, exit the 24th Street entrance and turn left. The Metro stop is Woodley Park/Zoo on the Red Line.

SUBWAY DIRECTIONS TO CAPITOL HILL

Metro pocket guides are available at the Summit Registration Desk.

TO THE SENATE SIDE

From Woodley Park/Zoo Metro station, take the Red Line in the direction of Glenmont to Union Station. Exit at Union Station via Massachusetts Avenue. At the top of the escalators, turn toward the rear and you will be facing the Capitol. Go left and walk around Union Station Circle to First Street, NE. Proceed south two blocks to the intersection of First and C Streets, NW. The Russell Senate Office Building is on the southwest corner at the intersection. The Dirksen Senate Office Building is on the southeast corner. The Hart Senate Office Building adjoins the Dirksen Building. (See map inside this program.)

TO THE HOUSE SIDE

From Woodley Park/Zoo Metro station, take the Red Line to Metro Center Station and transfer to either the Orange Line in the direction of New Carrollton, or the Blue Line in the direction of Largo Town Center. Exit at Capitol South Station (five stops). After you leave the Metro station, keep walking in the direction you exited (up the hill on First Street, SE), one block to Independence Avenue. The Cannon House Office Building is on the corner of Independence and First Streets, SE. The Longworth House Office Building is one block west on Independence Avenue. The Rayburn House Office Building is two blocks west. (See map inside this program.)

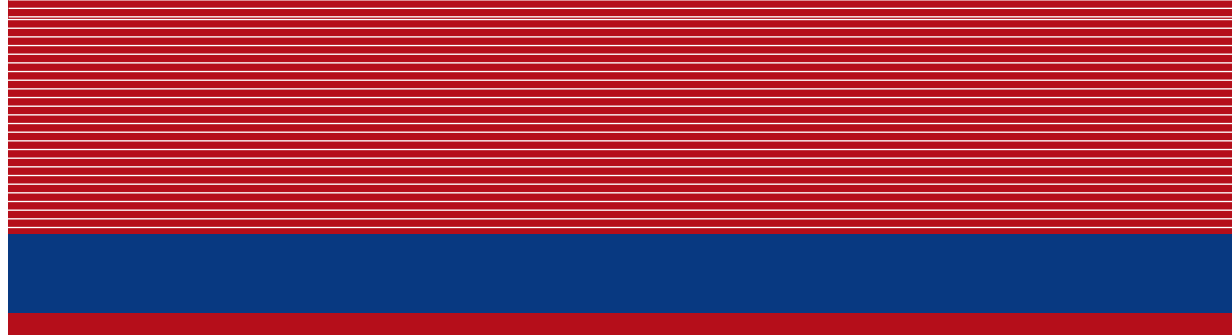

Round Table for Community College Lawyers

This year's seminar will focus on the federal "New Markets Tax Credit" subsidy program, a little-known federal program facilitating higher education finance of infrastructure projects that include classrooms, auditoriums, faculty and administrative offices, bookstores, dining facilities, day-care centers, or virtually any new commercial real estate infrastructure project related to a college's mission at below-market interest rates on a seven-year, interest-only basis, and capture an effective payback subsidy as high as 25-30%. Projects typically range in size from a minimum of \$10 million to hundreds of millions.

The regular community college litigation update will also be covered and CLE credit is available in more than 20 states.

President Barack Obama (Invited)
2010 National Education Service Award Recipient

Elected as the 44th President of the United States, President Barack Obama has been a strong and passionate supporter of community colleges as a major contributor to education, workforce development, and economic prosperity. Not since the Truman Commission has a sitting President focused more priority and attention on community colleges.

In this past year, President Obama and his Administration have appointed a number of key individuals with significant community college backgrounds including Secretary of Labor Hilda Solis and Under Secretary of Education Dr. Martha Kanter. Additionally, President Obama charged Dr. Jill Biden, the Second Lady, to publicly support and promote “opportunities that community colleges offer.”

President Obama’s education policy goals have centered on higher education. During his first address to Congress, President Obama outlined two ambitious postsecondary goals: 1) each American should obtain at least one year of postsecondary education; and 2) America will regain world leadership in higher education attainment by 2020. These two goals require a major community college involvement.

Most importantly, last summer President Obama announced the American Graduation Initiative (AGI). AGI represents the largest single federal investment dedicated to community colleges. AGI provides \$12 billion for community colleges, including: 1) \$2.5 billion for community college modernization (one year infusion); 2) \$9 billion for community college programs (over ten years); and 3) \$500 million for online course programs. In return for these funds, President Obama is calling on community colleges to graduate 5 million more students (degrees, certificates, transfers) by 2020.

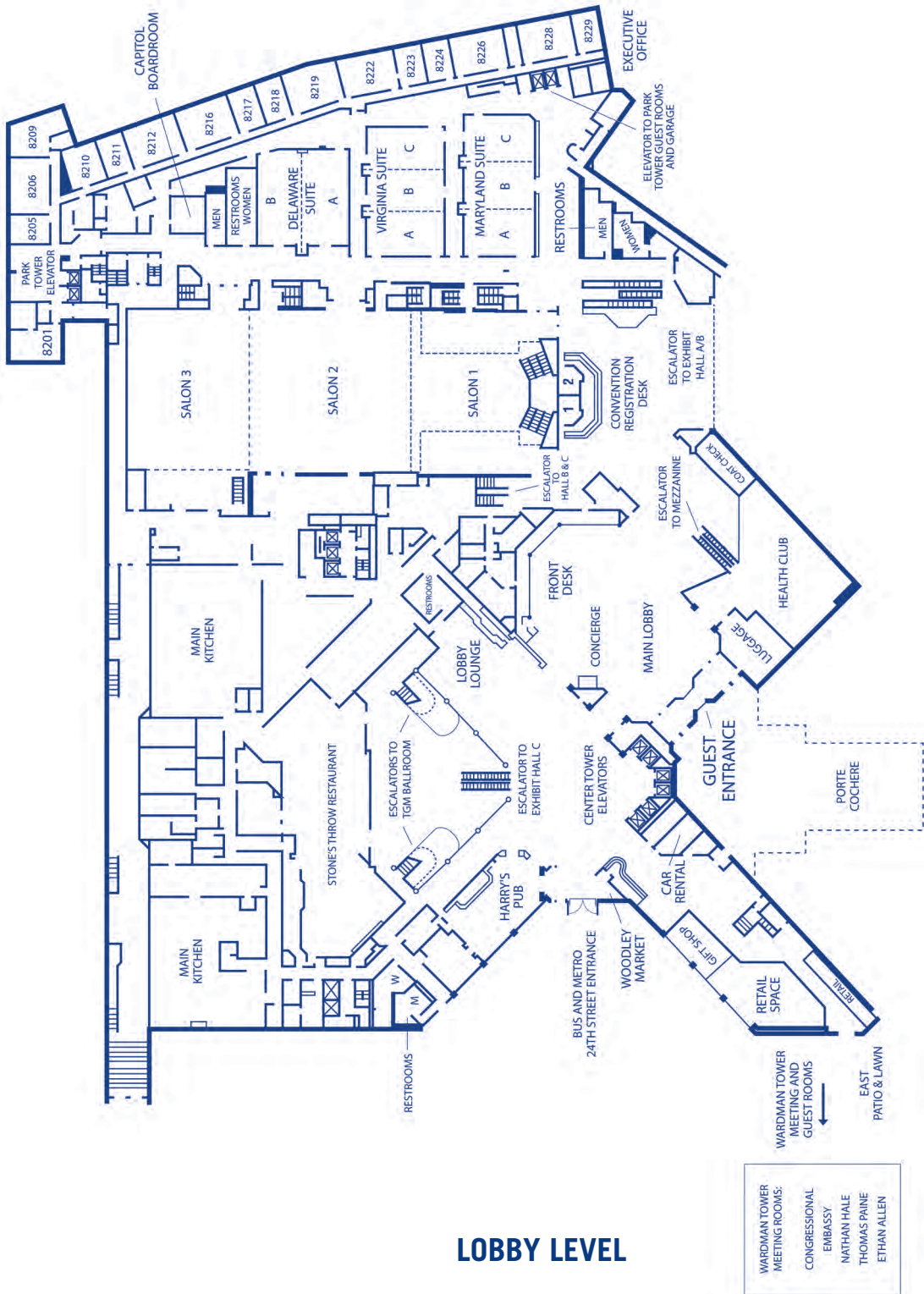

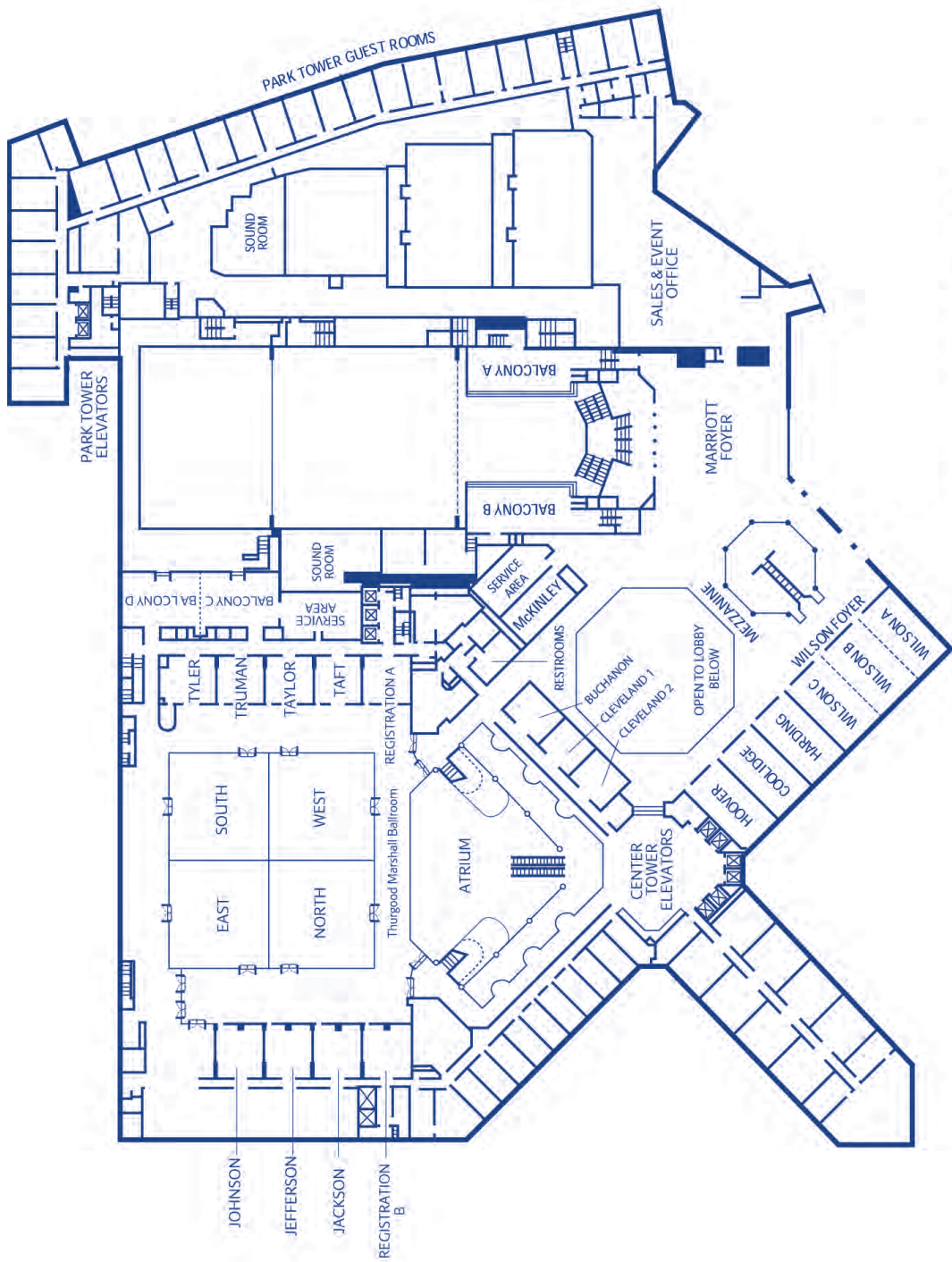
