Phillip L. Davis is the president of Minneapolis Community and Technical College (MCTC), which serves one of the nation’s largest urban centers. A member of the Minnesota State Colleges and Universities, MCTC is the state’s most ethnically diverse college, with an annual enrollment of over 12,000 students.

Mr. Davis started his professional career in 1976 as a suburban police officer. In 1979, he joined the staff of the newly formed Minnesota Board of Police Officer Standards and Training and helped to create the nation’s first police licensing system. His affiliation with community colleges began in 1985 when he became director of the Law Enforcement Training Center at Normandale Community College in Bloomington, Minnesota. Since coming to MCTC in 1992 he has served as associate dean of instruction, executive dean of finance and administration, vice president of administration and planning and interim president. He was appointed president in 1998.

Mr. Davis holds a bachelor’s degree in sociology from St. Cloud State University and a master’s degree in education from the University of St. Thomas.
